"For where two or three gather together as my followers, I am there among them." – Matthew 18:20 (NLT)

Dear members & friends of Trinity UMC,

The month of March begins the season of Lent, along with our countdown to Easter 2017. I look forward to this time of year every year, because it challenges me in my faith. It forces me to take a look at where I am in my walk with God ... and consider where I need to be. This is a season of intentionality. And I want to be intentional about my faith. I want to be pro-active when it comes to my relationship with God. Am I where I need to be ... or aren't I? Is God pleased with where we're at in our relationship, or is God a little concerned with certain aspects of our life together?

On Ash Wednesday—the gateway to the season of Lent, we'll begin a new worship series for the season entitled "Seeing the Unseen Christ: How His Presence Transforms Life." I don't know about you, but when someone really important comes to my house, it tends to affect my outlook, my perception of reality, and sometimes even my actions. I know Leverne Senn knows what I'm talking about, because one day she had a president of the United States visit her home—her farm. What if that would happen to you? Would it change your outlook, your perception of reality, or your actions?

Let me take this one step further. What would it be like to lean over to someone in church, realizing they were new to Trinity UMC, introduce yourself, then ask them their name ... to which they reply: Jesus. How would that grab you? What would it be like to share a pew with Jesus, the very one we come together to worship at Trinity (and, when you think about it, actually one of the Trinity)? Would it change your life in any way? I sure hope so. I would hope and pray that our lives would be absolutely transformed just knowing that Jesus was 'in the house'...

That's what we're going to be thinking about and studying about this season of Lent. Is the presence of Christ in our lives—all of our lives—powerful enough to help transform us into who God wants us to be? It's a great time of the year to think about this ... and think about it together.

Along with Ash Wednesday worship (March 1, 7 PM) and our regular Sunday worship times, we will also be gathering for Wednesday night group Bible Study during the season. We'll start at 7 PM on Wednesday nights in the Fellowship Hall. I'll be leading a Lenten theme-related Bible Study that's always a good time of fellowship too. Don't miss out on these opportunities to intentionally grow in your faith!

# Gwen's Pen

This is a simple, warm story. It has no exciting climax, deep lesson, or unforgettable action. It's just about everyday compassion.



Ben, my grandson from Eau Claire, drove down in his Suburban to "pick up" several larger pieces of furniture from the basement which, in an effort to rid my house of needless stuff, I had happily offered him several weeks earlier. He stayed the night and the following morning at 9:00 Dan and Tom Schmidt were at the door ready to help with the loading before they left on their Father-Son day together. The job went well. Our gracious, selfless helpers then brushed themselves clean of lint, cobwebs, and dust and left with our sincere thanks.

Before long, my son, Dave, phoned to say that he was gathering equipment for moving the piano from my house to his in West Ben and could Ben stay long enough to help him? No problem. Ben could stay until 4:00 if necessary. We spent our time talking and baked a pizza for lunch. Dave arrived in his Van, pulling a trailer loaded with planks, padding, and a piano dolly. The two of them lovingly wrapped and strapped the instrument, lifted it onto the dolly and moved it seemingly effortlessly out onto the deck.

Dave, a licensed Diesel mechanic, and a full-time driver of Semi tractor-trailers, backed the rented trailer down the driveway and with almost no maneuvering, jackknifed it 45 degrees, lining it up perfectly (with only inches to spare) between the iron railings on either side of the concrete steps leading to the deck. (I could have omitted the detailed description, but I am in awe of my son, and others of you, who can make a trailer do what you want it to do.) Planks from the deck to the trailer (over the steps and at almost the exact level of the deck) made the transfer smooth.

Dave and his precious cargo left a little after 4:00 and I was eager for Ben to leave as I knew it would be a long, lonely, dark drive back to Eau Claire and he had not slept well the night before at my house. We hugged and he urged me to call him for help in subsequent efforts to empty the house. He seemed reluctant to go, but after another hug or two, he was gone.

Suddenly the house was quiet but there was the non-faded, dusty rectangle on the carpet where the piano had been. There was the kitchen to put in order, dishes to wash, and the spare bed to strip. I got busy ... for about 20 or 30 minutes ... when the phone rang.

"Hi, Grandma. This is Ben." *What in the world? Car trouble? Forgot something? A second* "Goodbye"? Surely not an accident! "How would you like me to cook supper for you tonight?" "What? What are you talking about? Aren't you on your way home?" "Yeah. But I'd like to cook supper for you tonight." "Well, are you going to sleep over then?" "I don't know yet. Would you like me to cook supper for you tonight?" he repeated. "Well, sure. I'd love it." "Okay then. I'll come back, stop at the store, and then come cook your supper. See you in a little while." ...We had burgers, French fries, and lots of steamed broccoli "al dente" just the way I like it. He offered to help with the dishes, I declined and then he said, "Well then, I think I'll go." Following another hug and good-byes, he drove off in the dark just a few minutes after six.

I believe what prompted his return was the feeling of emptiness after a full day and his concern that I would be lonely when both he and Dave left at almost the same time. Also I had confided, during our afternoon conversation, that it was no longer fun to cook for myself and that often I planned nothing but just hunted through the leftovers in the fridge when it was mealtime.

Ben's compassion touched me. You, the reader, and Ben will probably not remember his thoughtful, selfless gift, but I'm sure I shall think of it often.
