### FROM THE PASTOR ...



#### "ALWAYS LOOKING AHEAD"

"One night the Lord spoke to Paul in a vision and told him, 'Don't be afraid! Speak out! Don't be silent!'" – Acts 18:9 (NLT)

Dear members & friends of Trinity UMC,

Vision is such an important part of our future with God. Scripture tells us (Proverbs 29:18, KJV): "Where *there is* no vision, the people perish...." It's that vital! And I believe God has given Trinity UMC a wonderful vision that will help carry us into our future—to be the people God desires us to be right here in Dodge County and beyond. And, as the scripture above encourages all leaders in the Church, a part of their job to continually bring God's vision before God's people, reminding them often where God is leading. So, here we go...

We know that, as United Methodist Christians, our mission is ... to make disciples for Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. This mission we hold in common with all followers of Christ everywhere. But how we go about that mission is going to differ from congregation to congregation. That's where vision comes in. And God has been faithful to provide us with that direction—a vision for the future. The banners hanging in our Fellowship Hall reflect the vision for Trinity United Methodist Church that God has been faithful to provide—how we are going to go about 'making disciples for Jesus Christ' here at Trinity. So, as we get ready to begin a new school year, this seems like a good time to review who God is calling us to be—gearing us up for the coming year:

LOVE – This is the first part of God's vision for Trinity and it seems so simple, doesn't it? Everyone knows what love is, don't they? Or do they? Did you know that even though the English language has only one word for LOVE, <u>Continued on page 2...</u>

ancient languages like Greek have several words for what we call LOVE. So it may not be as simple as we think at first. In a nutshell, this part of the vision has to do with loving both God and people (Matthew 22:37-40). How are we doing in these two areas? Are we loving God with all our heart, all your soul, and all your mind? My hunch is that we are all lacking somewhere in our relationship with God. And love, folks, is a learned skill (not just a feeling). And then there's the people part of this vision. How are we loving people in our lives? In general? Or specifically—you know, those people who irritate the heck out of you? God wants us to learn how to love them too. Not easy, is it?

GROW – I spoke about this a bit on July 23, in my message about 'growing up' (check this message out online, if you missed it live). This kind of 'grow' would be intentional growth, knowing that we do not 'arrive' until we meet Jesus face-to-face someday. Until then, we are in the process of discipleship—going on to perfection, as John Wesley would say. Ephesians 3:`17 and 2 Peter 1:2 speak to this part of God's vision for our church-for our lives.

SERVE – With Jesus as our primary example (Matthew 20:26b-28), we are to put our faith into action by serving God through serving others. We are the hands and feet of Jesus in this world that so desperately needs Jesus' brand of love! Our mission group who just went to Newberry, Michigan for a week of service is a great example of putting your faith into action. But you don't have to go 'on the road' for service to happen. There is so much to do right here at our own church, and in our own community, to help share our faith with others through our actions. If you want to be first in Christ's Kingdom, this is how you do it! (Ask Pastor Rom or one of the other staff if you're looking for a place to serve this year!)

So, there it is very simply. Once we 'get over ourselves' (Remember Kris Kristofferson's witness via video—Sunday, July 23?) and ask Jesus to become Lord of our lives, it is then that we'll have the power (Christ in us) to love, a deep desire to grow, and an incredible longing to serve God by serving others! Are you with me? Make sure you review and pray over each one of these steps of God's vision for us. Where are you at with each of these in your life? This ... is God's will for our church and for our future. This is how God has called us to make disciples for Christ! LOVE-GROW-SERVE...

#### **Greeters Wanted! Meeting on August 24**




### Trinity UMC's Mission Group Takes Off For God's Country Cooperative Parish in Newberry Michigan

The God's Country Cooperative Parish is in the eastern part of the Upper Peninsula of Michigan. It covers a 2500 mile area from Engadine near Lake Michigan, up to Paradise at Whitefish Bay, to Grand Marais on Lake Superior's south shore and encompasses McMillan, Germfask, Newberry and Hulbert. Although it is located in some of the most beautiful country you could ever hope to see, the isolation, extremely harsh long winters, and scarcity of jobs bring real challenges to these churches and the communities they serve. Unlike our more densely populated areas where you might find another United Methodist church within a few miles, these churches can be up to 100 miles from their sister churches in the Cooperative. Yet these seven communities of faith combine their resources, share their faith and, through their active presence, work to bring self esteem, hope and faith to all God's children throughout their vast parish. They are happy to host mission teams from all over Michigan and beyond to assist in sharing God's love with our hands and feet in minor home repairs - all summer long.
