It's so important to know we're shooting for the right targets, that we're placing our time and our energies and our resources in the right places—those that count for eternity. And we're going to be doing just that, as we continue to ask the question: 'Fan or Follower?' Won't you join us for this eye-opening series of messages on Jesus' teachings?

"KEEPING OUR EYES ON THE TARGET!"

Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a huge crowd of witnesses to the life of faith, let us strip off every weight that slows us down, especially the sin that so easily trips us up. And let us run with endurance the race God has set before us. ² We do this by keeping our eyes on Jesus, the champion who initiates and perfects our faith....

- Hebrews 12:1-2a (NLT)

Dear Trinity family,

This past month (Sunday, October 8), we celebrated 50 years of Trinity UMC being an active congregation. Its history actually goes back much further though, Trinity being the result of a merger of three area Evangelical United Brethren (E.U.B.) churches that decided to pool their resources to do more effective ministry in the future. And the ministry of those three churches goes back at least a century and a half each. What a history! What a legacy we've been left by those faithful disciples who came before. So, in the spirit of all Trinity UMC has stood for all these years, and after taking the time to celebrate the first 50 years in some very special ways, it's now time to prepare for the next 50 years! It's time to remember why Ebenezer, Immanuel, and Salem (the three congregations that made up Trinity) were started in the first place. Are you ready?

If you worshiped with us this past weekend, you heard a true story from the 2004 Olympics of Mr. Matt Emmons—a man who was competing in the 50-meter three-position rifle event. He didn't even need a bulls-eye to win. All he had to do with his final shot was to ... be on target. Normally, the shot he made would have received a score of 8.1, more than enough for a gold medal. But in what has been described as "an extremely rare mistake in elite competition," Emmons fired at the wrong target! Standing in Lane 2, he fired at the target in Lane 3! His score for a good shot at the wrong target? *Zero*. Instead of a medal, Emmons ended up in eighth place.

True story ... and that's a picture of what happens when God's people act more like fans than followers. If you asked them, "Fan or Follower?" they'd confidently answer "Follower." It's not a question of effort or desire; they're following hard. But, here's the problem: IT'S NOT JESUS THEY'RE FOLLOWING! Without realizing it, they're aiming at the wrong target! Instead of following Jesus, they're focusing on traditions—religious rules and rituals (see Matthew 23:1-28)! And they've confused their targets! That's something we don't want to see happen here at Trinity. As we begin our next 50 years together, let's make sure we're aiming at the right target. Let's make sure our focus is ... Jesus. Everything else is an incidental. Everything...

Folks, one thing is for sure: *If we're not aiming at the right target, we'll never hit it.* So, how do we do that—to get ready for the next 50 years at Trinity? Step one is ... get our eyes fixed on the right target—get serious about our walk with God, about being a disciple of Jesus Christ in a world that so desperately needs all he offers. And one of the easiest ways to focus on the right target ... is to join with the family called Trinity each week as we gather for our weekly worship celebrations. We have to *be* disciples before we can *make* disciples. That's what we're all about here. Join us, won't you, as we keep our eyes fixed on Jesus; the future (eternal) lives of others may just depend upon it...

I love it when something really stops to make me ponder life. I was reading an article on Christian Music and I found this so interesting.

I happen to love the song "What A Friend We Have In Jesus", but I never stopped to think about when it was new, or how it was written, or even if it was liked...

The quote below is a response from a parishioner in 1890...to this, at the time, new song which I love so dearly today.

"What is wrong with the inspiring hymns with which we grew up?" asks a parishioner in 1890 after hearing the hymn "What A Friend We Have in Jesus" one Sunday morning. "When I go to church, it is to worship God, not to be distracted with learning a new hymn. Last Sunday's was particularly unnerving. The tune was un-singable and the new harmonies were quite distorting" (from Dan Kimball's 2012 book, Adventures in Churchland, page 122).

TUMC recently celebrated 50 years...what a blessing! Throughout those years there have been many changes and there will be more to come.

Reading this short piece, made me stop to think that even though change may at first be distorting...as the parishioner refers to the song" What A Friend We Have in Jesus", that in time, change can indeed often become a truly beautiful thing...as I, the administrative assistant today, think of the song, "What a Friend we have in Jesus".
