As you read this article, we are at the beginning of the season of Advent 2018. This is traditionally a time of preparation for the celebration of the birth of our Lord and Savior, Jesus. And the holiday, Christmas, was named after him (Christ-mas). So, we will be preparing for that celebration by journeying together through the season. And the journey we will be on will be the same journey the Holy family was on that first Christmas—making this journey by looking at the characters of the Christmas story. - December 24 - “Good News of Great Joy ... for All the People!” based on Luke 2:8-20
- December 30 – “The Wise Guys of the Christmas Story...” based on Matthew 2:1-3

“THE INTENTIONALITY OF GOD”

“At that time the Roman emperor, Augustus, decreed that a census should be taken throughout the Roman Empire.” – Luke 2:1 (NLT)

Dear Trinity family,

I don't know about you, but I love this time of year! It's my favorite time. The season we're now entering into is called 'Advent'. It's a time of preparation for those in the church to be ready to celebrate the birth of our Lord and Savior, Jesus. And this year, we're going to take a 'Journey' together ... and walk through the Christmas story, just like the Holy couple did. One thing that has hit me, as I've studied this story once again (Luke 2), is the *timing* of everything that took place around Jesus' birth...

- How in the world could the prophets be right? How in the world could God finagle circumstances so Jesus, whose hometown was Nazareth (in the north), be born in Bethlehem (Joseph's hometown in the south)? A census (one and only) is the answer (see scripture above). This is how Jesus would be born in Bethlehem, just as the prophets had foretold...
- How in the world would God announce the coming of the Messiah—his son—to the world? God's timing again. The right shepherds were guarding their sheep just outside Bethlehem—within walking distance of the manger... Now, think about the whole story. A short time after Jesus' birth (eight days), his parents took him to the Temple to be circumcised and to offer a purification offering (according to the Law of Moses). Just in case the shepherds' message wasn't enough, how in the world would Joseph & Mary (as well as the rest of the world) be convinced this birth was of God? By the witnesses of two people at the Temple, at this time, whose names were Simeon and Anna. It was just the right timing for them to meet and greet the Christ-child—to witness to what God had done... And on and on his life went—a life of perfect timing... Jesus came into the world just when we needed him the most. We couldn't get any more lost, spiritually speaking! And God knew that. So came the Advent of God into our lives, in the form of a little baby named Jesus. God threw us a spiritual life-preserver ... and God's timing was perfect!

God's timing was also intentional. There was no other time in history that this would have worked. For only one census, in Roman history, was like this one—where people had to return to their home towns. God was very intentional about Jesus' life and the purpose of his life and the timing of his life.

This all gets me to thinking... It seems that the *intentionality* of God—including the perfect timing of God, is really a consistent part of the nature of God. It's all a part of who God is. And God is never contrary to his nature!


And if this is the case, what that means is ... just as God was intentional about the Advent of Jesus (coming into our world)—including the perfect timing, so too has God been very intentional about you—including his perfect timing. We may not understand God's timing sometimes. But that doesn't mean it's not active. And that's where faith comes in. I truly believe God has been intentional with your life and with my life. And, just as with Jesus, God's timing of your life is not a mistake. Rather, it too is intentional. You are here, right here—right now, for a reason. But what is it? What does God want you to do for him this Christmas season ... and beyond? If God was so particular with his Son's birth, and that perfect timing is a part of the nature of God, then what about your birth? Your life means more than you know...



Greetings from the bell choir!

Now that I have a few years of being your bell choir director I am starting to feel more comfortable and capable. The first year was kind of rocky and I was so unsure about almost everything. Or if we could even have enough people to have a choir. But week by week we rang the bells and worked out the wrinkles and kinks. And along the way we have really bonded together as a group. We even managed to perform a few difficult songs, especially The Prayer. We hope that you enjoyed the songs that were performed in October. When we performed the doxology and everyone sang along it brought back memories of our trip to England. At that very moment a wave of warmth and love enveloped me and I truly felt the presence of the Lord, our Savior. It is such an awesome feeling, of true love and acceptance, that without a doubt I was in the right place at the right time. If you haven't experienced this yet, you will soon!

Our song for November, "Faith of our Fathers", is a great, older hymn that we hope you enjoyed. Our next performance will be on Dec. 23rd when we will play Oh come, oh come, Emanuel. This song is so powerful, "REJOICE, REJOICE, EMANUEL". Then on Christmas Eve at the 5 o'clock service we will be performing "The Little Drummer Boy". This song has always been one of my favorites, kind of my mantra. For a long time I felt like I had no gift to bring, that was until I joined the bell choir 20 years ago. I feel, deep down in my heart and soul, that playing in, and now directing, the bell choir is my gift.

By now you have seen my name on the prayer list so I will shed some light on my health condition. I was diagnosed with chronic lymphocytic leukemia a few years ago. I am not sure if some of you remember that my mother had the same disease and received treatment in 2005, only needing 3 rounds of treatment and is still in somewhat of a remission. I was told that people live with this cancer for decades without needing treatment. Unfortunately, that is not the case for me. In June I had pneumonia, something I have never had before and I have been so exhausted. My recent doctor's appointment confirmed that I was getting worse with my white cell count raising rapidly. My doctor was kind of surprised by my blood work and we discussed what will happen next. The end of February I will have another CT scan and then discuss which type of chemo therapy will be started. This type of cancer is the most treatable one to have but I do not like needles. I do appreciate all of the prayers and offers of help and will try to keep directing the bell choir as much as I can.
