And as we once again walk through the story of Jesus' birth from the Gospels, etc., we'll discover that there are many ways God reveals his HOPE to us—for this time of year and beyond. Following are the messages you can look forward to this Advent of 2019:

- December 1 – HOPE IN THE SIGNS – Mark 13:24-37
- December 8 – HOPE IN THE PROMISE – 2 Peter 3:8-15a
- December 15 – HOPE IN THE MESSENGER – John 1:6-8, 19-28
- December 22 – HOPE IN THE ANTICIPATION – Luke 1:26-38
- December 24 – HOPE IN THE GIFT – Luke 2:1-20

There's a lot of HOPE to be had ... and we're going to celebrate the HOPE we have in Christ here at Trinity UMC! Come join us, would you? We'd hate for you to miss out on the HOPE we all need... *Pastor Rom*

HOPE ... IS WHAT GOD BRINGS!



“Suddenly, an angel of the Lord appeared among them, and the radiance of the Lord’s glory surrounded them. They were terrified,¹⁰ but the angel reassured them. “Don’t be afraid!” he said. “I bring you good news that will bring great joy to all people.

¹¹ The Savior—yes, the Messiah, the Lord—has been born today in Bethlehem, the city of David!” – *Luke 2:9-11 (NLT)*

Dear Trinity Family,

There’s something about this time of year. As Thanksgiving approaches and we move closer and closer to Christmas, things change. People’s attitudes change ... or their current state of mind becomes more and more transparent, feelings moving closer and closer to the surface. It’s the season, isn’t it? It seems to bring everything more clearly into focus. And that’s hard. For many, they’re dealing with loss—loss of loved ones, loss of life as they once knew it, and so forth. And the greatest need of the season? HOPE: that’s what we need...

Often, you’ll hear people use that word—HOPE. I hope it doesn’t rain. I hope I get the job. I hope we’ll have peace in our world this Christmas. I hope (you can fill in the blank). But worldly hope is often characterized by doubt. It wreaks of uncertainty, doesn’t it? We hope for things that may or may not happen—how we really feel.


The GOOD NEWS today is that, in Jesus, HOPE is a guarantee. It’s a sure thing. Our HOPE is actually (as one author put it) a ‘know-so’ rather than a ‘maybe-so.’ The writer of Hebrews helps explain. In Hebrews 11:1 (NLT), we hear: “Faith is the confidence that what we hope for will actually happen; it gives us assurance about things we cannot see.” Then, elsewhere in Hebrews (6:19), we hear: “This hope is a strong and trustworthy anchor for our souls. It leads us through the curtain into God’s inner sanctuary.” Connecting with one who is HOPE is what we desperately need!

Our HOPE this time of year, as Christ-followers, is found in the birth of Jesus Christ, our LORD. We’ll be celebrating his birth throughout this season. But even though we’ll remember his birth from the past, don’t ever forget that this season is also about the future. Advent is not only about preparing our hearts for Christmas. It’s also about preparing our hearts for Jesus. We long for a time when Jesus comes again and all will be renewed. But, we also experience the pain and suffering of today, as we eagerly HOPE for the future. That is where our HOPE lies—that baby born in a stable in Bethlehem ... is going to return again, and complete the work of God in our world. Paul, in Romans 8:24-25 reminds us: “We were given this hope when we were saved. (If we already have something, we don’t need to hope for it.²⁵ But if we look forward to something we don’t yet have, we must wait patiently and confidently.)

It’s hard sometimes to be patient—to wait. But this season reminds us it’ll be worth it. The one we can count on for today is with us—*Immanuel*. The one we can count on for our future is also with us. Jesus is a HOPE we can count on. He’s the answer to our hurt. He’s the answer to our doubts. Jesus is the answer to all our anxieties. He’s one we can count on. And this season, we’re going to celebrate that!



WHAT IS ADVENT ... AND WHY DO WE CELEBRATE IT?

Advent is the period of four Sundays and weeks before Christmas (or sometimes from the 1st of December to Christmas Day!). Advent means 'Coming' in Latin. This is the coming of Jesus into the world-a celebration of Jesus' birth. Christians use the four Sundays and weeks of Advent to prepare and remember the real meaning of Christmas. And here at Trinity UMC, we'll be doing that in a variety of ways--through song, through special messages prepared just for this season, and through the lighting of candles-a very special part of our Advent worship services where we remember specifically why Jesus' was born into this world. Do you want to know more. Join us for worship on Sundays at either 8 or 10 AM, then again on **Christmas Eve at either 3, 5 or 7 PM. Let's celebrate God coming into our midst together!**



Hallelujah!

“O Love of God, how rich and pure! How measureless and strong! It shall for evermore endure - the saints and angels’ song!” These lines are from the hymn entitled “The Love of God”, and have been a favorite of mine, made more powerful when I can see Joy Gardner, Guy Penrod and David Phelps give their all in singing the song. Most church music has its base in the Bible and the “Love of God” is no exception. It could be based on Jeremiah 31:3- “I have loved you with an everlasting love”. Much of our love of God can be poured out in song. Religious music fulfills many aspects of our walk with God. Music augments the written word of the Scripture, thus becoming an inspirational force in our lives. Music can cause our hearts to sing, it can uplift our soul and faith and it can provide comfort and solace to our life.

On a recent visit with Roy Meyer (my care receiver and inspiration), we listened to a CD of gospel music sung by various old-time country western singers. They were wonderful to listen to. When the hymn “In the Garden” was sung, Roy said it was one of his favorites. I said it was the song that said “And he walks with me and he talks with me”, Roy then repeated the other words of the song “while the dew is still on the roses and the voice I hear falling on my ear”. This hymn had special meaning for him as our favorite hymns have special meaning for us. I forgot to ask Roy why it was his favorite, mainly because I heard the Hymn “On the Wings of a Snow White Dove”. While I may have heard of it, it was not until I listened closely to the words, did the song take on a new meaning for me. Roy and I will be listening to other gospel music and I will remember to ask why “In the Garden” is his favorite.

This visit got me thinking of music of the church, the great number of hymns, anthems and gospel songs that are there. Most have a favorite hymn, favorite because it holds some special significance for us. It is always interesting when the opportunity presents that we sing the hymns shouted

out by members of the church that they wanted to hear. It would be interesting to know why they selected that hymn. With Christmas season nigh, we have people call out their favorite Christmas Carol to hear the congregation sing. My favorite hymn is “He Lives”. Why? Mainly because I had a number of heart attacks, the last was August 22, 2017 and the resultant rules on what I can eat, not eat and the possibility of another attack as I have A-Fibrillation and congestive heart failure. The words of “He Lives” has provided both comfort and inspiration for me. The refrain: “Because He lives, I can face tomorrow. Because He lives all fear is gone. Because I know he holds the future and life is worth the living just because he lives.” Who could not be uplifted by those words?

Music! How fortunate Trinity United Methodist Church is to possess a great many musically talented people. More fortunate because these people are willing to give of their time and talent to the benefit of us all. Priscilla, Jason, Pam and Sandy singled out for appreciation, but so must all the others in the choir, soloists, and various groups. They make music and I dearly love the musical presentations of the church. Kudos to all those who make the music. Seeing the people make the music makes the words more meaningful. Perhaps why I love the William Gather Homecoming presentations on DVD. I prefer the DVD format because you can hear the music and words, but they are made more potent because you can see the expression and intensity of their performance and also the effect on others.

Music can be powerful, satisfying and you can find a hymn to comfort and answer your every need, just as you can find them in the Bible. The Gaither video does an excellent job to displaying this music. So if you get an opportunity to view a Gaither DVD, do so and I guarantee you will not be disappointed. I have selected two illustrations from the series to illustrate the point. Both are tremendous experiences and I hope my words can convey the reason why these two were selected.

Music can be powerful and soaring poems to Jesus Christ. First is the Gaither rendition of “The Hallelujah Chorus” From the oratorical “The Messiah” by Handel. Anthony Burger, the pianist, displays his artistry and intensity along with the chorus to produce an electrifying performance. So powerful, one cannot help but to be swept up by the music, exhilarating! On a historical note, King

George of England, heard the work by Handel at a command performance. When the “Hallelujah Chorus” was played and sung, King George became so overwhelmed by the power and majesty of the music that he stood up in supplication to this moving salute to God. Being King, everyone in attendance also stood. Although time has diminished this tradition, people will still stand when it is played. See the Burger rendition!

The second example concerns David Ring. David was born with cerebral palsy and was told he would never reach manhood, but God had a different path for him. Not only did he reach manhood, he married, had three children and became an inspirational speaker. He knew that Jesus had given him victory. On the Gaither DVD you can see and hear him sing “Victory in Jesus” and it became his theme song. Words from the refrain best explains why. “O victory in Jesus, My Savior, forever! He sought me and brought me with His redeeming blood. He loved me ere I know Him and all my love is due Him. He plunged me to victory beneath the cleansing flood.” The Song by Ring is more powerful when you see this man struggling because of his condition, to get the words out. It is heart wrenching to see him fight to get the words, struggle to maintain the tempo which he couldn't. Difficult to watch, yet when done you get a feeling of pride. You understand why his favorite hymn is “Victory in Jesus”. No dry eyes here.

These are only two of the hundreds of selections I could have chosen from. Avail yourself of the DVD's of hymns and especially the Gaither videos.






