- February 2 HOW TO PRAY FOR OTHERS 2 Timothy 1:3 The first series of 2020 is called ... VERTICAL. You're not going to want to miss this one, folks ... as we learn to connect with Heaven!

#### WHAT WILL THE NEW YEAR HOLD?

"So don't worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will bring its own worries. Today's trouble is enough for today." – Matthew 6:34 (NLT)

Dear Trinity family,

As we begin a brand new year (and decade) together, we do not know what the future will hold. But, as followers of Christ, we know who holds our future. That's not just a cute saying or song lyric. That's truth straight from Jesus—from the famous Sermon on the Mount—Matthew 6 (above). And, folks, when Jesus says 'don't worry,' we need to put our faith right there! There is no other option for those who are true disciples of Jesus.

In this New Year before us, there are so many uncertain things about life. For some of us, we don't know if we'll be working in the same place all year or if that will change. For some, we don't know what kind of relationships we'll experience in the New Year; there may be some changes there too. For others, it may be health issues that are in question in the New Year. The truth is ... we just don't know! The one thing I do know though is this: we have a choice about how we're going to approach this New Year—what attitude we'll approach it with! The truth is, we can either 'worry' or 'not worry.' There's our choices.

In light of these choices before us, let me ask you this. Has worrying ever gained you anything in the past? Has it helped you with a job you're in? Has it helped you with a relationship you've had? Has it helped in the midst of questionable health issues you were facing? My guess is ... 'no.' According to Jesus, that's not the best choice for us. Some have even said that worrying is denying God is who he says he is. That's not what we want to do, is it?

The other choice we have is to be obedient to what Jesus—our Lord and Savior—has taught us through our 'instruction book.' And we can do that with confidence. What does Jesus tell us? "...don't worry about tomorrow...." Doesn't that sound good? To not have to worry about anything? We need to move from believing that ... to living it. The Psalmist is a great example (Ps. 112:6-7, TEV): "A good person will never fail; he will always be remembered. <sup>7</sup> He is not afraid of receiving bad news; his faith is strong, and he trusts in the LORD." Does this describe you, as a Christ-follower? It should...

The truth is (if life hasn't taught you this already), we're not in control. No matter how much you want to be in control or think you're in control, you're not. That's a part of the world we live in. But the GOODS NEWS, as we begin this New Year together, is that provisions have been made. You know somebody. You know someone who actually is in control. And they love you more than anyone ever could or could even dream of! And he—the Christ of Christmas, the One who is in control—has told you not to worry.

Worry comes from fear. We worry in life because we're afraid of something. One of the characteristics of a life filled with the Spirit of God is ... NO FEAR. Jesus isn't asking us to do something impossible. He's just saying in essence, 'Open your life to me. Let me fill you with my Spirit. And fear will be gone—your reason for worry.' Won't you allow Jesus to have his way with you, as we begin the New Year? Won't you allow the Spirit of Christ to fill you, that you might be empowered to live a life free of worry?

Pastor Rom's sermon on the second day of Advent concerning the second coming of Jesus Christ; I was truly amazed at the hundreds of passages in The Bible referencing the second coming of Christ. I also added that many of us will meet Christ before the second coming. Pastor Rom also issued a challenge to each of us, are we prepared for our meeting with Jesus prior to the second coming? As I contemplated the significance of what he said, I found myself thinking about tomorrow and was drawn to the words of the hymn: Morning Has Broken. The opening phrase is "Morning has broken like the first morning.", but it is the last verse that has a greater message: "Mine is the sunlight! Mine is the morning born of the one light Eden saw play! Praise with elation, praise every morning, God's recreation of a new day."

Every tomorrow begins with the morning heralding a new day and that day will end with the sunset. What we choose to do with the new day may have great implications. Are we preparing to meet Jesus, are we choosing the right path to take, are we getting right with God? So significant because the new day may well be our last day and sunset-how well prepared would we be? Since no one knows the time nor day of our last sunset we must ensure our preparedness. I am 81 ½ years old and have seen over 30,000 mornings, over 30,000 days and over 30,000 sunsets. There are others that have seen more and others that have seen less- whatever the case, it was important what we did in those days. Did we choose the right path to take, did we make the right choices and decisions? Did we prepare ourselves to meet the Master?

Dottie Rambo, songwriter, hymnist and gospel singer wrote a hymn to illustrate this challenge. The hymn was: Too Many Sunsets Lie Behind the Mountain. In the hymn she equates our walk of life with crossing the hot burning desert and the struggles with the right path to take. We all make choices every day of our life and that becomes part of our heritage- what she refers to as sunsets behind the mountain. She infers that there would be days in which we would stray from the right path or make choices contrary to the teachings of God. So each of us may have made many mistakes in our past- our sunsets behind the mountain. But no matter how many of those sunsets lie behind our mountain, there is always the hope of tomorrow and the promise of a new day to get right with God. The hymn uses the metaphor of finding clean cool water or quench our thirst from crossing the hot desert. It isn't the quenching of our thirst she is alluding to, it's the finding of salvation.

We are ever tempted by earthly pleasures. Which sometimes contributes to our deviation from the straight and narrow way. A line from "Turn Your

Eyes Upon Jesus" alludes to these earthly pleasures: "the things of earth will grow strangely dim in the light of His glory and grace. While we may have wasted many a sunset, God never ceased walking and talking with us. God's love never wavered and it's that love that helps us return to the right path and there comes a time when we meet God again. After that meeting and true repentance- our life becomes different. There is a new power in our life- Jesus Christ.

Tomorrow can cause uncertainty because we are not sure what the morning may bring. It can bring grief, despair, sorrow, fear, loneliness and hopelessness, but it can also bring happiness, joy, love serenity and hope. If you are prepared to meet God and you have faith in Him, tomorrow will never be a problem, it doesn't matter about the sunsets. Because He lives, I can face tomorrow, because he lives all fear is gone. I know who holds the future. How Awesome! Being prepared makes all the difference, so how do we really know if we are prepared to meet God? Alfred Acklay, a hymn writer, penned the following lyrics that really addresses the question of preparedness. He wrote: He lives, He lives, Jesus Christ lives today! He walks with me and talks with me along life's narrow way. You ask me how I know, He lives within my heart." That's the answer and what a message of hope and why tomorrow is something to look forward to- all of us will put many sunsets behind the mountain, but belief in God and it's everlasting love makes our life and the living worthwhile.

Ethel Waters, a professional singer and later a member of the Billy Graham Crusades gives us an example of being ready and not fearing tomorrow. Old and confined to a bed, she went through the California earthquake. Following the quake, Cliff Barrows of the Billy Graham Crusade went to see her. He asked if she was afraid during the quake. Her reply was now, I got God's number and he's got mine and I'm ready to go. Her signature hymn was "His Eye Is on the Sparrow" and one of her last comments was "See you in Heaven!"

Am I prepared for the second coming or the meeting with Jesus? Not knowing which tomorrow morning it will happen, my answer is hopefully I am. I don't know how many more sunsets I will put behind the mountain, but in that tomorrow, because of faith, I will see Jesus and reunite with loved ones that the Lord has led on. Another hymn comes quickly to mind: "What a day that will he, when my Jesus I will see. When I look upon the face of the One who saved me by His Grace. Then He will take me by the hand and lead me to the Promised Land. What a glorious day that will be." Are we prepared for that tomorrow? The Answer needs to be YES!!

I'm going to choose one of the following reading plans ... and would ask you to do the same. It's your choice this year!

The following options are from <a href="www.bibleplan.org">www.bibleplan.org</a> and should help everyone—no matter what your time restrictions—to find a plan suitable to your needs:

**Yearly plans** (i.e. Bible in a Year, New Testament, Old Testament, Chronological, Chronological (with readings from the OT and NT), M'Cheyne Reading Plan, and 2 Chapters per Day: NT, Proverbs, and Psalms.

Monthly plans (i.e. Proverbs, Psalms, New Testament, and The Gospels).

1 Chapter per Day plans (i.e. Entire Bible, New Testament, Old Testament, and Psalms).

**Assorted Other Plans** (i.e. Advent—Luke's Gospel, Bible in 90 Days, Old Testament in 2 Years, All the Words of Jesus, and New Testament Letters).
