In October, we'll be finishing up our 'CREED' worship series. AND, we'll also be asking 'So what?' as we go through this series. In other words, what do these beliefs mean to my life right now? We live in an uncertain time, if there ever was one. 
"True Worshipers

Jesus replied, "Believe me, dear woman, the time is coming when it will no longer matter whether you worship the Father on this mountain or in Jerusalem. ²² You Samaritans know very little about the one you worship, while we Jews know all about him, for salvation comes through the Jews. ²³ But the time is coming—indeed it's here now—when true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and in truth. The Father is looking for those who will worship him that way. ²⁴ For God is Spirit, so those who worship him must worship in spirit and in truth." – John 4:21-24 (NLT)



Dear Trinity friends,

Recently, I posted an interesting sign that I'd found on the Trinity UMC Facebook page—one that I think is most relevant to the time we're in right now. I've seen way too much evidence, as



we've gone through the changes we've seen in the past few months, to not believe this is true. It says, "We've made Christianity a building-centric faith. But buildings don't reach people. People reach people." What a great reminder of who the Church actually is—people sharing the Good News of Jesus with people! A short time ago, I read an article covering an interview that had taken place on an NPR show toward the end of August. It was an interview with David Kinnaman, President of the prominent Christian research organization known as the Barna Group. The premise

of the interview, and thus the article, was that Barna's best predictions were this: As a result of shutdowns stemming from the coronavirus pandemic, as many as one in five churches could permanently close within 18 months. (They'd actually made this prediction back in June, so it was even more so the case by the end of summer.)

As a long-time pastor, here's my best interpretation of that Barna report. The future does not look good for those churches who have forgotten who they are and why they exist. For those who have forgotten the Great Commission—Jesus' command to go and make disciples, there is probably not much of a future for their ministry. They will not make it. The pandemic has probably just magnified what was already lacking in those congregations. BUT, if a church wants to pursue Christ—truly wants to worship God as God's word directs and share Christ with this hurting world we live in, they will be just fine now and after the pandemic ends. If you look closely at what the Barna Group's recent report is really getting at, that's probably a fairly accurate summary. Those whose only ministry is keeping their building (tradition) going, in other words, won't make it. But, for those who still know why their building is there, who still know who they worship and what worship and ministry are all about, they will be just fine. So, why are we here? What is it that God wants us to be about? This is the perfect time to be asking ourselves these questions, if we want to have a future after this pandemic is over.

Jesus had a tendency, in his conversations with others, to cut to the chase, so to speak. He had that kind of conversation with the Samaritan woman at the well one day. She knew he was a man of God, because he told her what her life had been about—something only someone close to her should have known. And I believe, in this story, she was searching for a deeper truth about God than she'd previously known. She needed God in her life. So she started by sharing with Jesus what she did know—from her tradition. The 'place' to worship (the most important thing in those days) was Mt. Gerizim for the Samaritans. This was the place where Abraham and Jacob had both built altars (Gen. 12:7; 33:30). According to their 'tradition,' this was the mountain where Abraham had come to sacrifice his son Isaac. So, for the Samaritans, this mountain held the same spiritual prominence as the Temple in Jerusalem did for the Jews. But, this was one of those times where Jesus' response was ... 'yes, but I tell you....'

What did he tell them? Truth and spirit are what living worship is all about, not the geographical location—not the place necessarily. Jesus turned the tables on everyone's tradition here as he let this woman know that it is *who* we worship that is of utmost importance. Worship in ignorance, regardless of what name we give it, is a sham and an empty form. This had become the situation among the Samaritans who had removed themselves from a great deal of the prophecies and teaching of the Old Testament. Sadly, they worshiped what they did not know.

I'm so thankful Jesus set the Samaritan woman straight, as well as the rest of us, when he taught that 'true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and in truth.' Then he mentions, 'The Father is looking for those who will worship him that way.' In other words, what we're about is not so much about tradition as it is attitude. It's not the place we worship—on this mountain or on that mountain, inside a building or outside a building—that counts. What counts is that we know the One whom we worship and that we approach our gathering together in the same spirit. 'God is Spirit,' as Jesus reminds us ... and his Spirit is LOVE. Is it in that spirit that we're coming together these days, as true worshipers of His?

Thank you to those who've been so faithful to join us in worship over these past several months—both online and 'on the grounds.' We have a great heritage, as Methodists/ Evangelical United Brethren, in open-air preaching. But we have more than that. We have Jesus' teaching about what it means to be 'true worshipers.' If our focus remains on that ... and coming together in the right spirit, there is nothing we cannot accomplish for the Kingdom of God, both now and in the future!

Stewardship and Finance Offering

During our last SF Moment Kathy Drexler gave a very heart-warming testimonial of how her and Pete looked at their stewardship to God decided to take the leap of faith and start tithing. The blessings they received meant so much to them. We know what the Bible says...give and you will receive. We probably all think this means if we give money, we are going to get money in return. The blessings the Drexler's received were greater to them than money. There is a quote from Dave Ramsey "Good things that cannot be calculated or quantified are set in motion in your life and in your finances when you give." Read that quote again, "things that cannot be calculated or quantified". The blessings God gives when you make the decision to start giving for the first time or you decide to up your giving (climb the giving ladder), or to start tithing are endless. Those blessings may not be in the form of money but in our health, our families, our relationships, our jobs, our sanity, and the list goes on. We need to always remember to be positive and keep thanking God for our daily blessings; we woke up, we had food to eat, we have shelter, and you have people that care about in at Trinity. I struggle with these on a daily basis we probably all do. Remembering to thank God is a tough habit to start, remembering that when my family gives its weekly offering to give it with happiness and to say a little prayer on that gift to God. The blessings that the Drexler's received are there for everyone. The SF team wants those uncalculated blessings along with financial blessings for you and your family.

I'd like to leave you with a story from our Maximize book we are studying in our SF meetings. "You may have heard the famous anecdote about how people catch monkeys in India. Long ago, an insightful hunter figured out that monkeys are selfish creatures, so he created a method of capture that takes advantage of that nature. First, the monkey hunter cuts a small hole in the one end of a coconut — a hole just big enough for the monkey to fit his hand in — and ties a long cord to the other end. Then he puts peanuts, banana chunks, or some other enticing treat into the hole, places the coconut in the monkey's path, and sneaks away, holding the other end of the cord. Inevitably, an unsuspecting monkey comes along, sniffs out the treat, and wiggles his little hand into the hole to grab the treasure. With that, the hunter's job is done. All he has to do is yank his side of the cord, and the entire monkey/coconut kit and caboodle lands at his feet. But isn't something missing here? Why wouldn't the monkey just pull his hand out of the coconut and run for his life? Remember monkeys are selfish. Once they get their hands on something they want, they won't let go. With his fist wrapped around the goods, the monkey can't get his hand out of the hole. If he would just loosen his grip and let go of the bounty, he could save himself. But he clings tightfisted to what's "his" and finds himself ensnared...even unto his own demise."

We to find ourselves being just like the monkey's, holding on tight, afraid or nervous to trust God with our finances. To give back with what God has given us. I too have the same resolve at times and I have to work on it daily to be thankful for all the blessings that are given to me and then give to God with that thankful heart. Kathy's story helped remind me of that, helped remind me why it is important to give each week unselfishly. We are all here to help each other along the way.
