

UPCOMING SERMON SERIES FOR SEPTEMBER 2020

WELCOME to Fall 2020, as we begin a new school year and a new ministry year at Trinity UMC. This year going into the fall year is quite different from past years. Even with planning for public school, or Christian Education, everything is still a bit uncertain. So, we're going to start a worship series that will speak to 'certainty', not 'uncertainty.' And I think we all need that... On Labor Day weekend, we will be worshipping ONLINE ONLY with our bishop & cabinet from the Wisconsin Annual Conference. Starting the second Sunday of the month, we'll be into our new worship series called "CREED: What do you believe?" Here are the topics for each week of the month:

- Sept. 6 SPECIAL WORSHIP WITH BISHOP/CABINET FROM THE W.A.C.
- Sept. 13 LIVING WHAT YOU BELIEVE 1 Cor. 16:13
- Sept. 20 LIVING WITH GOD AS FATHER Psalm 46:1
- Sept. 27 LIVING WITH JESUS AS SAVIOR Eph. 1:13

Our 'CREED' series will then continue into October for a few Sundays. One thing we can always count on, no matter what's going on around us, is our faith in God—God himself. God is never changing. We can always count on a steady relationship with God. And this is the series to help make sure we have that going for us! Won't you join us for worship either 'on the grounds' or online, with our new series starting on the 13th of September? Remember: Our special worship with the bishop & cabinet will be ONLINE ONLY for Labor Day weekend (the 6th). We look forward to you joining us for worship in September, as we remember just what it is we actually believe...

"GOD'S SANCTUARY"

"They are like trees planted along the riverbank, bearing fruit each season. Their leaves never wither, and they prosper in all they do." – Psalm 1:3 (NLT)

Dear Trinity,

This past Sunday, I mentioned that we had the privilege to worship in the most beautiful sanctuary God has ever created. And, I'll stick by that. Except for one Sunday morning, all since we have returned to corporate worship have been absolutely gorgeous—near perfect. And we thank God for this beautiful sanctuary that—at this time—is probably the safest place we can gather as a large group during the current health pandemic that still exists around us.

What struck me this week was how often 'God's sanctuary' is mentioned or described in God's word—particularly the book of Psalms. The theme begins right away in Psalm 1 and moves along from there, really concluding in the last book of the Bible—Revelation. So, it's a consistent and powerful theme in scripture.

If you look at the scripture above—the first of many 'sanctuary' texts, you'll see one of the early descriptions of God's sanctuary. In Psalm 1:3a it says: "They are like trees planted along the riverbank, bearing fruit each season"—a great description of the sanctuary—the place God's people gather (or actually God's people). And, like many examples from scripture, the actual place can be anywhere (John 4:21). The imagery here is that of God's people being a garden. And the purpose of that garden is to 'bear fruit.' Bearing fruit is generally associated with 'bearing witness' or sharing our faith with others. The more we delight in God (v. 2), the more fruitful we will be. But that only happens when worshipping God is our regular source of nourishment.

The next line in this sanctuary psalm (Ps. 1:3b) is this: "Their leaves never wither, and they prosper in all they do." In describing God's sanctuary (i.e. the people who gather to worship), this does not mean they are immune to failure or difficulties. Nor does it guarantee health, wealth, or happiness. What the Bible means by prosper (prosperity) is this: When we apply God's wisdom (from the hearing of God's word, for instance), the fruit we bear (i.e. living our faith, sharing our faith, etc.) will be good and will receive God's approval. Just as our trees here 'on the grounds' soak up the water God has given them lately, and bear luscious fruit (i.e. acorns, etc.), we are also to soak up God's word, producing actions and attitudes that honor God. To achieve anything worthwhile, we must have God's Word in our hearts. That's what happens in God's sanctuary. And we have the most beautiful sanctuary God ever created right here at Trinity—YOU!

At the end of the Bible, Revelation 21:3 to be exact, yet another 'sanctuary' text appears: "I heard a loud shout from the throne, saying, 'Look, God's home is now among his people! He will live with them, and they will be his people. God himself will be with them." And he is ... right here in his sanctuary!

I understand there are those who are purposefully staying away from worship right now due to COVID-19, it's level of contagion, compromising health issues, etc. But what about the rest of you? We miss you! The 'sanctuary' just isn't the same without you. And this is where your spiritual nourishment takes place. Make sure you join us either 'on the grounds' or online as we begin a new worship series in September called 'CREED: What do we believe?" It'll be eternally worth your while...

Stewardship and Finance Offering

It is getting close to budget review time again and for a lot of the SF committee it will be our first go at this. At our last meeting we reviewed a list of items that the Trustee's put together that will need to be handled in the coming years.

Some of those items are:

-Repairing the parking lot
-Repairing or replacing pew cushions
-The car port tower needs up keep
-Windows in the parsonage need replacing
-There are trees that need to be removed at the parsonage before they come down on their own
-The church needs to upgrade our phone system as it is about 25 years old and not working properly



Now this may seem like a lot of items that need to

be taking care of but your SF team is working together with the Trustees to look at how to do all these items the most economical way. We are also reviewing how to plan for these as we know it will take several years to make all this happen, so we need to start discussing a game plan and how to budget for these items. Together we are trying to find ways to use all resources available to Trinity.

One of our best resources is ourselves and our weekly giving. Everything we are able to do at Trinity is because of each of you and your faithful giving. All the things we have is because of what we put back into our church – "Time, Talent, and Treasure". 

Hello Parents of Trinity,

Over the past month the education committee has gone back and forth on our options regarding Sunday school and youth group for the upcoming school year. Many factors came into play and many decisions had to be made. Because of the room size, it would not be possible for many of our classes to meet in person and maintain social distancing. We also discussed having class outside, but there were too many obstacles to overcome. As a compromise, we opted to go virtual.






