Update from the SPRC

Good Morning, It's June 27th and time to give you another update on what's happening with Pastor Rom and Jane and our church.

Rom and Jane have secured a home in the Nashville Tennessee area. The conference moving company will load up their household belongings on Monday, July 19th. On Tuesday, July 20th Rom and Jane will drive their two vehicles to Nashville. Rom will be pulling a U Haul. The Pegram's son, Josh, and Rom's brother, Byron, will be driving to Nashville with Rom and Jane. Josh and Byron will fly home after helping with the move. Some members of the congregation have offered to help move belongings to Nashville but that should not be necessary.

Rom and Jane greatly appreciate the help they are receiving from various members of the congregation. The volunteer procedure facilitated by John Muentner seems to be working well. Thank you very much!

Rom's medical team has determined the DNA of his cancer which allows them to treat it more specifically. Rom may be eligible to participate in a pancreatic cancer research study. Tomorrow, June 28th, Rom has another CT scan and blood drawn to be analyzed for cancer markers. He meets with his Froedtert pancreatic specialist on Tuesday, the 29th and he should get the results of those two tests. Please join me in praying for the best possible results! That same day he also begins another three week round of weekly chemotherapy. He should get a week off of chemo on July 20th which is why they are moving that week. On Thursday, July 22nd, Rom has his first appointment with his new Nashville area oncologist. He anticipates that his chemotherapy treatments in Tennessee will begin the last week in July. Rom says that God is working out the details beautifully. Rom should have his maximum energy level during moving week when he will need it the most.

Kate Jones, our DS, will be bringing an interim pastor and their spouse to meet the SPRC during the first week of July. Kate and the UMC Conference have determined that our interim pastor will serve Trinity from September 1, 2021 through June 30, 2023. Almost two years. This is one year longer than I first anticipated. As most of you know, the United Methodist Church is not as "united" as we would like it to be. It is likely that during 2022 a lot of changes may occur in the UMC. This interim pastor will have the challenging task of guiding Trinity through these changes. I understand why Kate and the Conference think it is wise to have the same pastor shepherd Trinity through the potential difficulties of 2022. Making a pastoral change at Trinity in 2022 would not be a wise decision. I will let you know who our interim minister is as soon I am able to do so.

Pastor Mary has graciously agreed to continue to serve Trinity for one extra month, the month of August. She has informed the SPRC of a previously planned vacation for a week in August. The SPRC intends to talk soon about pulpit supply for the month of August.

The trustees have some projects on the docket for the parsonage this summer. They will have from July 21st through August 31st to complete those projects. New windows have been ordered for the parsonage. New flooring for the basement is being considered. Jeff Unferth is looking for someone willing to paint the kitchen ceiling. Contact Jeff if you would like to volunteer to paint. We do not yet know if the interim pastor will move into the parsonage.

We love Rom and Jane and many of us would like to have one more personal conversation with them before they move. This situation that we find ourselves in is heartbreaking. It's heartbreaking for Rom and Jane, too. They want to have one on one time with us as well, and they realize that they can't. Please don't be put off if they decline your invitations to get together. They have so much to do, Rom has limited energy, and they must move in three weeks. On top of that, Rom's immune system is compromised due to the chemotherapy treatments. If you want to let the Pegram's know how you feel about them take a memory page when you leave church this morning. Fill the page with the message that you would like to communicate to them and get the completed page back to church by July 11th. You could send them a card with a note of appreciation. You can certainly attend our Sunday service at 9:00 on July 18th celebrating the ministry of the Pegram's. Rom will be preaching that sermon live and in person.

God is at work managing all the moving parts, folks. If you are like me, you may need to remind yourself that God has a wonderful plan for Trinity, Rom and Jane and for each one of us. Let's trust and obey God because as the song says, "for there's no other way. To be happy in Jesus, but to trust and obey". -Thank you!

<u>Stewardship and Finance</u> <u>Offering</u>

Jesus Christ said more about money than about any other single thing because, when it comes to a man's real nature, money is of first importance. All through Scripture, there is an intimate correlation between the development of a man's character and how he handles his money. – Richard Halverson

"But people who long to be rich fall into temptations and are trapped by many foolish and harmful desires that plunge them into ruin and destruction. For the love of money is the root of all kinds of evil and some people, craving money, have wandered from the true faith and pierced themselves with many sorrows." – 1 Timothy 6:9-10 NLT

First Timothy 6:10 is one of the most misquoted and misinterpreted verses in all of Scripture. While the verse says, "For the love of money is the root of all kinds of evil", most lay Christians and leaders alike hack off the first four words. The popular statement has become, "Money is the root of all evil." Let me clear things up. Money is not the root of all evil. The love of money is. Money is morally neutral. It takes on the characteristics of the one who possesses it. In the hands of a wise, generous person, money becomes a tool for worship, good works, family provisions and the God-focused enjoyment of life on earth. In the hands of an unknowing and/or ungodly person, money becomes a tool of power, greed, and self-indulgence. The majority of American Christians live in the vast middle ground that lies between these two types of money handlers. They haven't yet learned how to use their money in a God-honoring way, but its out of ignorance rather than rebellion. Culture's voice has been much louder than the church's voice on how to view and structure their finances, so unwitting Christians have fallen into the traps of materialism and debt along with everyone else. Part of our role as leaders who are shining a light on this issue of

stewardship is to reach people to handle their money biblically as part of their overall financial management. When people begin to understand that giving back to God is not an option but a command and a key element in their overall financial health, they will want to be systematic (regular) givers, at the very least. And, I contend, they will quickly move toward giving the whole tithe. – Maximize: Nelson Searcy

Most people think that being part of a Stewardship and Finance Committee is determining the budget: what to spend money on and what to cut. From my time on this SF committee, I have realized that is such a small portion of your duties. The true and larger obligation of a committee like this is to learn how God wants you to handle your personal finances. How to give unselfishly and graciously every time you put your tithes and offerings towards the church. To put God first in your finances because he COMMANDS us to. To work towards tithing diligently and stick with it once you are tithing. Then once you have that understanding, how do you help the rest of the congregation, and your family, and your friends realize the same things that you have begun to learn and do. How do you convince people that this is the only way to handle your finances; is God first and everything else after? That if you put God first and truly trust in him, <u>**HE**</u> will take care of the "everything else".
