Dear siblings in Christ,

Summer is here and with it seems to come our best effort to take a break and relax. Summer vacations are upon us. I will miss you for 3 weeks as I plan to take a 2-week vacation following by the week of the Annual Conference (May 24 to June 12, 2022). But even though we are looking to get away from things for a few days, life goes on.

The month of June focuses on two events: Pentecost Sunday and VBS (Vacation Bible School).

The apostle Paul wrote to Romains saying, "For I am not ashamed of the gospel, because it is the power of God that brings salvation to everyone who believes: first to the Jew, then to the Gentile. For in the gospel the righteousness of God is revealed, a righteousness that is by faith from first to last, just as it is written: "The righteous will live by faith."" (Romains 1:16-17)

Pentecost is observed on the seventh Sunday after Easter and 10 days after Ascension. This year we will celebrate Pentecost on June 5<sup>th</sup>. That day, when the Holy Spirit came upon those who were gathered in the Temple, the power of God was shown to many. In fact, it's reported there that 3,000 came to faith that day. God showed amazing power, symbolized by the sound of a "great wind", the "Tongues, as of fire" over the believer's heads, and the ability to speak and understand other languages that was exhibited. As the Day of Pentecost is described in Acts 2 God made an amazing display of power that caught the attention of all who were present. While many believed there, some others refused to believe.

Sometimes we have the intention of thinking that the power that God showed that day of Pentecost is missing in our lives today, but the apostle Paul's epistle to Romans 1 above states that the power of God in our world today is not found in the amazing works we see displayed but in the Word of God, the "Gospel", which God has given to us. He shows His power as He changes hearts through that message. So, it is very important to teach the word of God to our children from the early age as says Proverbs 22:6, "*Train up a child in the way he should go; even when he is old, he will not depart from it.*"

This year at Trinity UMC, VBS (Vacation Bible School) will be held from June 3 (6pm-8:30pm) to June 4 (8:30am-2:30pm). Here we teach our children lessons and stories from the Bible. We believe the Bible is the Word of God and that it is authoritative, accurate and inspired.

Many, however, no longer accept the Bible as God's Word, or as inspired or authoritative. Some will argue that the Bible is out-of-date and out of touch for a 21st-century audience. Others are uncertain of its origin and the story of the Bible. But we (Trinity UMC) will never stop standing on the truth and the power of the Gospel.

During the two weeks we will spend together in June, we will explore the sermon titles based on the scriptures below:

June 19<sup>th</sup>: "Go and Tell How Much God Has Done for You" (Luke 8:26-39)

June 26<sup>th</sup>: "It's Not Always Easy, but Do Not Be Afraid" (Luke 10:1-11, 16-20)
