Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

As many of you know, Tshishinen and I spent two weeks out of country. We are glad to be back after spending a very good time in South Africa and in the Congo, enjoying good weather, reconnecting with family members and old friends, and meeting new people, and somehow, having crazy moments of packing, repacking our bags, and going through security gate processes at different airports, taking off our shoes, belts, and hats. We praise God for bringing us back safely and thank you for your prayers.

We need to remember too that this month is not a month without

any significant Christian holiday. For most people the last day of October is known only as Halloween day, but it is considerably more important to know that this day is the annual celebration of the Protestant Reformation. October 31st is Reformation Day! On this day, we celebrate God's work through his servant, Martin Luther, to preserve the message of the gospel as the free gift of God's grace in Jesus Christ through faith alone.

This year we celebrate the 505th anniversary of one of the most important moments in our Church History when Martin Luther nailed his 95 Theses to the door of the church in Wittenberg, Germany to call into question some of the practices of the Roman Church and this gave birth to the Protestantism in 1517.

The question is why it is continually important to remind ourselves of this event of Church History in the 21st century, and the answer is the Gospel itself.

The Gospel was and continues to be the main issue in the Protestant Reformation, along with the critically associated issue of authority and where we derive our understanding of that precious Gospel. The points of the Reformation can be summarized with the traditional Five "Solas". That Scripture Alone (Sola Scriptura) is the ultimate authority in the Church, and that sinners are saved by grace alone (Sola Gratia), which is received through faith alone (Sola Fide), which is placed in Jesus Christ alone (Solus Christus) all to the praise and glory of God alone (Soli Deo Gloria).

It's important to remember that the Reformation is not over! It is a daily reality for us as Christian believes to turn from our self-righteousness and trust in the free grace of Christ offered to us in the Gospel. In that sense, the Reformation continues every day in our lives. But it also needs to continue among our churches.

With all the transitions we are going through in the United Methodist Church, the question is what can we do while we are waiting for God to move us towards the next path?

- -Stand on God's Word.
- -We need to have faith.
- -We need to strengthen our relationship with God.
- -We need to trust our God and let Him take the lead as proverbs 3:5-6 says, "Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do not rely on your own insight. In all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make straight your paths."

As we find ourselves in a season of waiting, please join us in worship every Sunday and this month we will explore the following verses and sermon titles:

- -October 02, 2022, Luke 17:5-10: Increase My Faith, Please!
- -October 09, 2022, Luke 16:19-31: The Gate and the Chasm Are the Same Thing.
- -October 16, 2022, Luke 18:1-8: The Power of Persistent Prayers.
- -October 23, 2022, Luke 18:9-14: The Humble Will Be Justify.
- -October 30, 2022, Luke 19:1-10: Redeemed, Transformed, and Redirected.

In this season of waiting, please, wake up each day with the intention to be good and do good. Spread light, not darkness. Give compliments freely, smile kindly, give generously, don't complain, speak only kind words, and never tear people down. Above all always remember to be obedient to God's word, to trust Him, and to be humble.
