Beloved siblings in Christ and Friends,

As we are journeying though the season of Lent, have you ever thought about the joy in sacrifice that Lent provides? Most of us don't delight in sacrifice; in fact, in our daily lives, we often do our best to avoid challenges and practices that push us outside of our comfort zones.

Yes, Lent is truly a hard time. It is a time to look in the mirror of truth and see our inner self. We were truly beautiful people. We were created in the very image of God. Yet the result of sin and evil have left us and our world terribly distorted. The Devil has made us disfigured individually and collectively.

Lent is the time and the place to repent. We need to confess and bring to the Lord Jesus our sins and those of the world-the ones that are personal and corporate (selfishness, dishonesty, pride lust, anger, racism, prejudice, addiction, animosity, conflict...)

Lent is a heart-rending time. "Repent your hearts, not your garments, and return to the Lord your God" (Joel 2:13). It is a time of penitence and change. The focus of Lent is on self-denial, on "giving something up."

Victory can be found when we deny ourselves and pick up our crosses and hardships in order to grow closer to Christ! The engagements of self-denial and repentance are appropriate when the sacrifice connects with Christian commitment. But there is another view of Lent: a time to prepare to celebrate the Resurrection.

When we prepare to celebrate something, we often do housekeeping assignments. If we are going to have a party at our house, we first spend some time cleaning the house. We lay in a supply of refreshments. We decorate. And when all is ready and the guests arrive, we celebrate. Preparing is never quite as much fun as celebrating, but it takes the preparation to make the celebration possible.

Lent is like that, a time for spiritual housecleaning, closets cleaning, a time to dust off our sins, make our hearts "right" and "straight", shine up our commitment, lay in a supply of thanks and decorate our lives with the joy of the Christian life. Then, when Easter comes, we know in our hearts what the celebrating is all about.

And that's the way it is with Easter. It's definitely a time for celebration. We celebrate the victory of life over death, of light over darkness, of delight over drabness. Jesus, the Son of God, our brother, and Savior, died to sin and rose to glory. Dirt and death hold us no longer. In him, The Risen Savior, we too will rise above our limits, even that of the grave. We in our world can come to a New Life a New Spring. It's time for celebration!

Now that we have voted to leave the United Methodist Church, we have three major questions before us, two of which need to be answered soon. What denomination do we align with? What is our new name going to be? How do we pay the disaffiliation fees of \$165,700? I'll address the denomination and name questions here.

We have had one congregational meeting to discuss the new denomination and name. The Disaffiliation Task Force and the Administrative Council are recommending that we affiliate with the Global Methodist Church. This would allow us to maintain our Methodist roots and to align with a denomination that does not have a trust clause (I.e., we hold onto the deeds of our properties).

It may seem like we are moving fast on the denomination and name decisions, but we need them finalized so that legal work can be completed. This includes the official agreement with the Conference, incorporation, changing over deeds, letterhead, etc. For our new name, there is consensus that "Trinity" should be part of our new name.

We are planning a time for another congregational vote on March 12th, after worship. This will again be for members only but it will not be required that you be there in person. There will be a three-day window to vote March 12 through March 15th. If you are not in church on March 12th, then you will need to call or email Pam Wellso, who will check off all names on the membership list as their vote is received. (920-905-9511 or <u>pam-back312@gmail.com</u>) Decision will be finalized based on a simple majority vote.

The ballot is not finalized, but it will look something like this:

CROSS THE WORLD

MAKING GOD'S LOVE VISIBLE, ONE CROSS AT A TIME

CROSS THE WORLD is a faith based ministry located in North Central Minnesota. They started up in the spring of 2011 with a mission to touch as many people's lives with a simple reminder that God is in their corner, no matter what encouragements they may need. Whether they've lost a spouse or child, suffered a financial or job loss, been diagnosed with a physical ailment ... whatever is presently tearing at their heart, everyone needs to know that God loves them. Their business sized crosses snuggle nicely into the palm of a hand, or fit into a pocket or purse, or sit by the kitchen sink ... and they remind us that God is with us wherever we are!

CROSS THE WORLD's mission started as the vision of one man, their friend Harlow. Deeply spiritual, Harlow was a numbers man and, knowing that the daily birthrate worldwide was about 340,000, he calculated that if only ONE PERCENT of that daily population growth was introduced or reunited to knowing God and basking in His goodness, the number of Christians across the world would seriously rock Satan's world! Harlow joined his Saviour before he was able to launch this exciting spiritual adventure, but, through five of his friends, CROSS THE WORLD was born and they are committed to carry Harlow's dream to everyone they can, telling them that Jesus loves them.

Each 'Pass It On' cross is crafted by a volunteer's hand, one at a time in their woodshop. The crosses measure 4'' tall x $2 \frac{1}{2''}$ wide x $\frac{3}{8''}$ thick, a little larger than the business card sized message tag that is attached to each of them and they are constructed of various woods ... pine, birch, cherry, oak to name a few. No two crosses are alike; sometimes, not all the cross parts for that individual cross are the same.

Interestingly, all the wood they work with in their shop is given a second chance ... first rejected by a cabinet maker, it is recycled into a small cross and then freely passed on to others so it can live again. What a beautiful visual reminder of God's love for us and how freely He gives His love so we can all live in Him! Each cross is accompanied with a message tag, either in English or Spanish.



This picture was taken in Newberry, Upper Michigan where our church mission team traveled in 2017. Everyone who participated in the devotion gathering that day received this cross. Such a simple gift and message made a big impact to those who were sharing their time and talents with God's Country ministries.

The **Trinity Shoebox Project** orders these same crosses and gifts them in our shoeboxes, hoping to pass on the same encouragement. Would you consider a \$20 donation to cover the cost of 100 crosses for our shoeboxes? Blessings to you.
