



Opportunity is Knocking on Your Door!

On Sunday, August 13th, I was in Manitowoc for the day, visiting my former church, then meeting girlfriends for a kayak trip. The pastor speaking at church that day is their District Superintendent for the Evangelical Free Church. He used the scripture in Ephesians 4 to remind us that all people in the body of Christ ARE the church, and all people play a role in the stability and maturity of the church and the people who attend. Our purpose, in Eph 4:12-13, is *to prepare God's people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up until we all reach unity in the faith, and in the knowledge of the Son of God and become mature, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ.*

How do we do this? How do we produce spiritual growth and maturity in our Christian lives, and how do we produce growth in our church? Foremost, by everyone trusting Jesus for their salvation and having a personal relationship with Him. Then, by participating in the community of our Body of Christ, our church home. And, by regularly practicing the disciplines taught and encouraged by the words in our bibles: worship, prayer, fellowship, study of God's word, ministering to others, reaching out to our community and the world.

How do we know what we're doing is working? Eph 4: 14-16: *Then we will no longer be infants, tossed back and forth by the waves, and blown here and there by every wind of teaching and by the cunning and craftiness of people in their deceitful scheming. Instead, speaking the truth in love, we will grow to become in every respect the mature body of him who is the head, that is, Christ. From him the whole body, joined and held together by every supporting ligament, grows and builds itself up in love, as each part does its work.*

While waiting for our kayak time, I went to Goodwill and bought a book I've heard of before, but hadn't read, *Love Does*, by Bob Goff. I've only read a few chapters so far but it spoke to me as I think about where we are in this transition in our church. The author lives his life by not just feeling love, or verbally telling someone about love but *Doing Love*, by showing others the love of Jesus by *Doing*, by *Acting*, in someone's life so that they see the love of Christ for them. A small bit paraphrased from the book: *Living a life fully engaged is something most people plan to do, but forget, or put it off to another day. God didn't chose "someone else" to express His presence to the world. He chose you and me. We are the means, the method, the object and the delivery vehicles. We need to stop plotting the course and instead just land the plane on our plans to make a difference by getting to the "do" part of faith. In the end, love doesn't just keep thinking about it or keep planning for it. Simply put: love does.*

Now, maybe this sermon and this book had an impact on me because I often call myself Procrastination Pam, or the Queen of Good Intentions. Can anyone identify with this? But, now is the time to have a new attitude. Instead of sitting in the pews taking everything in, what is it that you can do to foster growth in our church, to foster new attitudes, spiritual growth and maturity in the lives of those we connect with at least weekly in our church building.

God has given each of us some ability to make an impact in the lives of the church, our community and the world.

Why do we do what we do with Operation Christmas Child? I mean really, what is the reason? I've been thinking a lot lately about the reason I pack shoeboxes, lead area teams, deal with some of the situations on my Shoebox Shoppers Facebook page and am passionate about OCC. We talk about the great commission a lot, but do we actually think about how this ministry fulfills that commission that the Lord gave us? At Easter, we are all thinking about Jesus's death and resurrection. And then what happened after that? One of the very last things that Jesus shared with his disciples was the GREAT Commission.

"Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore, go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely, I am with you always, to the very end of the age." Matthew 28:18-20

Obviously, if this was one of the last things he shared then, it was something very important. I think sometimes in the busyness of what we do and the "tasks" that we have we forget the simpleness of this command. That is the most beautiful thing about it. It's something we can ALL do. I think that's why it was one of his last commands. Think about it:


- *We all have authority from heaven and on earth
- *We can all make disciples
- *We can all teach new converts to obey God's commands

The ministry of OCC just makes that even easier for us to do. Each shoebox is a small commission heading out to make disciples and that is followed up with teaching them as well through The Greatest Journey. It actually is a very simple gift and simple process and yet so life changing. Especially when you think about the families, friends and neighbors that will also hear the gospel because we all send simple gifts.

Jesus is with us to the very end of the age as we participate in this ministry, his ministry, done with his authority. Think about the lives touched by this ministry because we take time in our lives to follow His Great Commission. Over 150 countries in 25 years have received shoeboxes. If that isn't going into all the world, I don't know what is. So many languages, so many closed off areas that might never have heard without our simple gift. So many people who were lost and needed to hear God's simple message of His amazing gift to them.

I think so often we don't really realize how we are fulfilling God's commission to us through our service with OCC. We get stuck in the details, the tasks that need to be done, the events that need to be planned, people that need to be trained and the problems that can arise etc. We feel like we aren't missionaries out spreading God's word or pastors teaching God's children. But that's the awesome thing. WE ARE! We may not be in those 150 countries or be teaching TGJ, but we are making disciples and teaching them because we listened to God's call in our lives to serve with the ministry of Operation Christmas Child. We are training others to serve, we are organizing churches and groups to pack, and we are growing the ministry here in the US so that it can go out to all the nations. That is the GREAT COMMISSION!

So, next time you are in a quiet moment, grab a shoebox and take the time to pack and pray over each item you put inside it. Just be in that moment and actually think about what you are doing. Think about Jesus telling his disciples to spread the gospel to every nation and fast forward to what you are doing in that VERY MINUTE. Think about how that box will connect you with one child who will hear about Jesus and whose life may be forever changed because you are following Jesus's command to spread the gospel. I think we get caught up in the busy work of the ministry so sometimes it's just important to be in that one moment and remember what it is that one box really means. Pray for that child who will receive it and then close it up and know that is one more time you have shared the gospel to all the nations!
