Dear Beloved Trinity Methodist Church Family,

As we stand on the cusp of March, the weather in Lomira presents us with a unique backdrop for this year's transition from the reflective season of Lent into the bustling heart of spring. With sunrises arriving unusually early and temperatures swinging dramatically between 13- and 70-degrees Fahrenheit, navigating this climatic complexity adds an unexpected layer to our daily routines and spiritual practices. A daily scripture reading can help us feel grounded, giving us stories of faith to think about, especially about Jesus' journey to the cross. This unpredictability, however, mirrors the ever-changing journey of faith, reminding us of the need for adaptability and resilience in our spiritual and community lives.

Amidst these environmental challenges, our journey of faith and community engagement at Trinity Methodist Church continues to deepen and expand. March promises to be a month bustling with spiritual activities and opportunities for growth, reflection, and fellowship. As we navigate through the significant moments of our Lenten journey, we are also preparing our hearts and minds for the joyous celebration of Easter.

This month, we gather with renewed focus and dedication, embracing a schedule rich in spiritual nourishment and communal engagement. Our Prayer Meeting on the second Tuesday at 6:00 pm will be a time for us to come together in prayerful support of one another, lifting our needs, hopes, and thanksgivings to God. Our sermon series for March will guide us through pivotal moments in the life of Jesus, offering insights and reflections that are pertinent to our theme of growth and spiritual development:

- March 17: John 12:20-33, "Dying and Rising"
- March 24: Mark 11:1-11 & Mark 15:1-15, "From Hosannas to the Shadow of the Cross"
- March 31: Mark 16:1-8, "Who Will Roll Away the Stone For Us"

March is a call to deepen our discipleship, to engage more fully in the life of our church, and to reach out with the love of Christ to those around us. Let us embrace this busy month with open hearts and minds, ready to be transformed and to witness the power of God's grace in our lives and in our community.


Bakers—donations of coffee cakes are needed as well!

Adults \$10, Kids 4-10 \$6, Kids 3-under are free. **Donations of coffee cakes needed.**



hockey on the Peshtigo River in Argonne with friends when they spotted smoke coming from his home. They ran down the road in their skates to find the house engulfed. The only thing they could save was the stove that started the fire.

Being farmers, my parents couldn't leave their livestock, so they cleaned up an outbuilding and made it their temporary residence.

On March 30, 1939, Mom went into labor with her first child. The snow was so deep, the town's bulldozer plowed a path to the bridge leading over the river. The bulldozer couldn't clear the snow on the bridge, however, because the equipment was too heavy.

The doctor rode to the bridge and then walked the rest of the way to my parents' place on snowshoes. He delivered me in the chicken coop.




