Susie was very interested in hosting and brought home an informational flyer, so I went to an organizational meeting at school and came home President.

3) What is your favorite thing to do?

I love family get togethers, and especially when all are present! I also enjoy attending grandkids' activities: concerts, theatre/stage performances, and hockey games. On a daily basis, I spend many hours reading and watching TV: sports, game shows, mysteries, and news. I also enjoy lunch with friends. In the summer I enjoy going to Buttermilk Creek Park for concerts sometimes twice a week. During the fall through spring, I enjoy going to Lighthouse Big Band at Thelma Center for the Arts twice a month. In the past, I enjoyed low impact aerobics at the FDL Aquatic Center, where many friendships were
