Dear Beloved Trinity Methodist Church Family,

After our yard cleaning on Monday, April 22, 2024, I decided it was time to stow away my snow shovels, hoping that we've bid farewell to those white blankets for many months to come! Each passing day reveals more signs of spring. Maple trees are tapped, drawing sap for the production of maple syrup. Tulips have already burst into bloom, while yards are once again adorned with vibrant green grass.

As we witness the renewal of the earth, we also celebrate the renewal of our spiritual lives. This month, we will mark the occasion of Pentecost on May 19, a day significant for Christians worldwide. Pentecost, observed on the fiftieth day following Easter, commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles and other followers of Jesus Christ while they were in Jerusalem celebrating the Feast of Weeks. Michel is set to graduate after shifting his studies from physics and electronic engineering to filming, photography, and videography, a change necessitated by his health challenges. We see God's hand in his journey and rejoice in His faithfulness: "God is good, all the time", as affirmed in Psalm 100:5.

This month, we will also delve into several touching scriptures and themes in our sermons, which reflect our continuous growth and learning in faith:

May 26, 2024: "From Head Knowledge to Heart Transformation" (John 3:1-17)



When a mommy tells you, "No, No, No."


She plants a seed of SELF-CONTROL
