## Stewardship and Finance Offering

Hello all, it has been some time since I last wrote to you. We just had our latest SF Meeting, and we felt it was a good time to provide some updates on our Church's finances. Let's start with how we finished the 2024 year. We averaged 33 weekly offering contributors; we had a weekly giving average of \$3,090, and we ended the year with a deficit of \$15,731.

We received around \$5,000 during our Christmas Eve services, and we voted to give 10% of that offering back to church missions. We voted to give \$250 to the OCC program and \$250 to the Feed My Starving Children program. Mission programs are not part of the regular budget, so it is a way we can help those groups.

The Men's Group Ministry will be utilizing the Easter Breakfast money they raised to support current and future endeavors. The trustees reported on the quotes received about the driveway and bell tower. The bell tower has been priced at \$40,000 - \$65,000, depending on different options of repair. The driveway could be done in three separate sections, but it would be less expensive (\$190,000) if we do it all at one time. We are in a place now where both these projects are at the forefront and need to be done. The SF committee discussed some options to cover these projects and will present them to the Church Council at their next meeting in May. If the Church Council approves to proceed with either of these projects, the Trustees will then pursue additional quotes to get the best quality professionals and price.

The sound system and Praise Band equipment are sounding good after Metro Sound helped with some setting changes and updates. We reviewed a quote from Metro Sound to update the Sanctuary speakers to more modern equipment, but at this time, we felt it best to table this project as the Tower and parking lot will need to take priority.

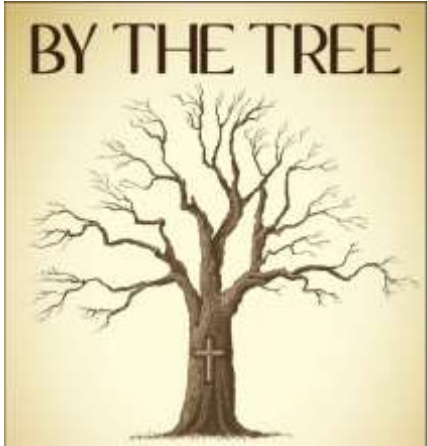

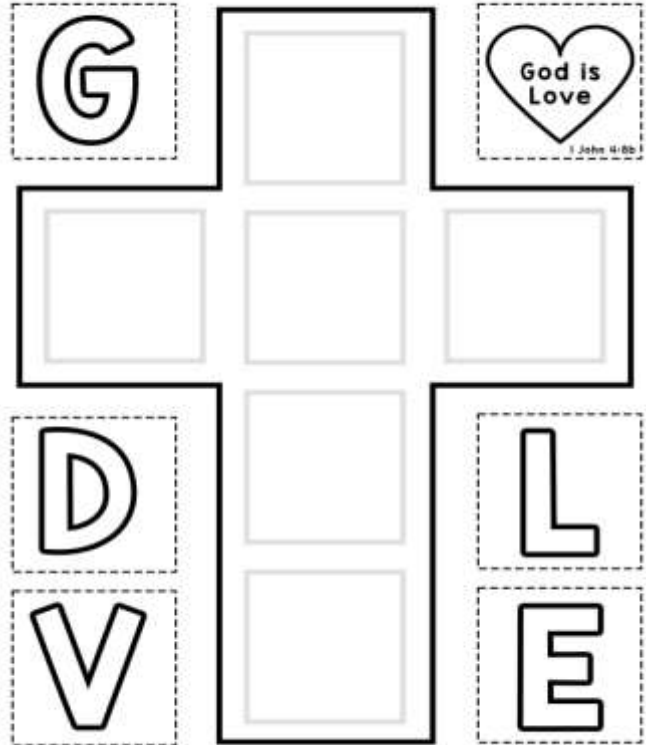
